AUSTRALIAN OVERSEA TRADE - SEPTEMBER, 1933.

The Monthly Summary of Oversea Imports and Exports for September, 1933, has been made available by the Commonwealth Statistician (Mr. E. T. McPhee).

THE TRADE POSITION. Imports of Merchandise (valued in British currency) were £stg.4,888,000 in September, 1933, as compared with £stg.4,858,000 in August. Exports of Merchandise (in British currency) were £stg.8,008,000, compared with £stg.4,544,000. Imports remained stationary, while Exports increased 76 per cent.

Compared with the corresponding month (September) of last year, Imports of Merchandise in September, 1933, were 5 per cent. lower, the totals for the respective months being £stg.5,141,000 and £stg.4,888,000. Exports of Merchandise in September, 1933, (values in British currency) were £stg.8,008,000 as against £stg.6,348,000 in September, 1932, an increase of 26 per cent.

Total Imports, including Bullion and Specie, were £stg.4,976,000 in September, 1933; £stg.5,023,000 in August, 1933; and £stg.5,208,000 in September, 1932.

Total Exports (values in British currency) were £stg.8,642,000 in September, 1933; £stg.5,240,000 in August, 1933; and £stg.7,106,000 in September, 1932.

Imports of Bullion and Specie for the above periods were £stg.88,000; £stg.166,000; and £stg.66,000, respectively, as against exports of Bullion and Specie (valued in British currency) of £stg.634,000; £stg.696,000; and £stg.758,000.

THE BALANCE OF TRADE. In the following table the balance of Oversea Trade is estimated in British currency values for the month of September, 1933, and for the three months (July, August and September) of the year, 1933-34, and is compared with the corresponding periods of the year 1932-33.

For the month of September, 1933, there was a favourable commodity balance of £stg.3,120,000, compared with a favourable balance of £stg.1,207,000 during the previous September. Taking Bullion and Specie into account, there was a favourable balance of £stg.3,666,000, as compared with a favourable balance of £stg.1,899,000 for the corresponding month of last year.

For the three months ending September, 1933, the commodity balance was favourable to the extent of £stg.3,510,000, compared with an unfavourable commodity balance of £stg.1,799,000 during the corresponding three months of 1932. Taking Bullion and Specie into consideration, the total favourable balance for the three months of the trade year 1933-34 was £stg.5,172,000, as against an unfavourable balance of £stg.189,000 during the three months of the trade year 1932-33.

Preliminary figures for October, 1933, indicate that both imports and exports will be higher than for September.

## IMPORTS - COMPARISON WITH PREVIOUS PERIODS.

Imports (valued in British currency) of Merchandise were £stg.4,888,000 in September, 1933; £stg.4,358,000 in August, 1933; and £stg.5,141,000 in September, 1932. Imports of Bullion and Specie were £88,000, as against £stg.166,000 in August, 1933, and £stg.66,000 in September, 1932. The total imports for the above periods were £stg.4,976,000; £stg.5,023,000; and £stg.5,208,000, respectively.

(a) September, 1933, and September, 1932. Compared with the corresponding month of 1932, imports (values in British currency) increased in the following classes of goods:- Class I. - Foodstuffs of Animal Origin, £66,400, as against (£50,800); Class II. - Foodstuffs of Vegetable Origin, £246,400 (£188,000); Class VI - Animal Substances (not Foodstuffs), £79,600 (£71,000); Class XI - Stones and Minerals, £42,400 (£23,600); Class XII(b) - Metals and Metal Manufactures, including Vehicles, £532,700 (£490,800); Class XV - Earthenware, China and Glassware; £111,000 (£86,100); Class XVII - Jewellery, Fancy Goods, £77,900 (£71,500).

On the other hand, the following classes of goods show decreases, compared with imports during September, 1932:- Class IV - Tobacco and Preparations thereof, £26,800, compared with (£62,100); Class VIII(b) - Textiles, £1,176,200 (£1,328,200); Class VIII(c) - Yarns and Manufactured Fibres, £205,100 (£246,300); Class IX - Oils, Fats and Waxes, £383,700 (£509,100); Class XII(a) - Machines and Machinery, £293,600 (£306,900); Class XIV - Wood and Wicker, £105,200 (£125,200); and Class XIX - Drugs and Chemicals, £299,700 (£334,600).

Imports in the following classes showed little variation in the two periods - Class III - Spirituous and Alcoholic Liquors; Class VII - Vegetable Substances and Fibres; Class VIII(a) - Apparel and Attire; Class X. - Paints and Varnishes; Class XIII - Rubber and Leather; Class XVI - Paper and Stationery; and Class XVIII - Optical and Scientific Instruments.

(b) 1st Quarter, 1933-34, and 1st Quarter, 1932-33. Imports (values in British currency) of Merchandise during the 1st Quarter of the Trade Year 1933-34 were £stg.14,065,000, as compared with £stg.15,092,000 during the corresponding period of 1932-33. The total imports (including £stg.333,000 Bullion and Specie) were £stg.14,398,000, against £stg.15,385,000 (including £stg.292,000 Bullion and Specie) for the corresponding period of 1932-33.

The classes of goods which showed increased imports were:- Class II - Foodstuffs of Vegetable Origin, £763,000, as compared with (£579,000); Class III - Spirituous and Alcoholic Liquors, £106,800 (£79,000); Class XI - Stones and Minerals, £98,300 (£64,500); Class XII (b) - Metals and Metal Manufactures, including Vehicles, £1,795,700 (£1,489,100); Rubber and Manufactures thereof, £212,400 (£138,400); Class XV - Earthenware, China, Glass, etc., £290,400 (£223,800); and Class XVII - Jewellery and Fancy Goods, etc., £225,200 (£194,800).

Fairly substantial decreases in imports of the following classes of goods were recorded:- Class IV - Tobacco and Preparations thereof, £133,600, compared with (£192,200) during 1st Quarter, 1932-33; Class VII - Vegetable Substances and Fibres, £359,200 (£439,000); Class VIII(a) - Apparel and Attire, £295,900 (£329,400); Class VIII(b) - Textiles, £3,288,200 (£3,897,600); Class VIII(c) - Yarns and Manufactured Fibres, £618,300 (£847,500); Class IX - Oils, Fats, etc., £1,235,200 (£1,521,900); Class XVI(a) - Paper, £657,300 (£805,800); and Class XIX - Drugs, Chemicals, etc., £846,000 (£1,040,500).

The principal commodities showing increased imports were :- Tea, £564,800 as against (£315,500); Whisky, £88,520 (£58,300); Asphalt, Bitumen, etc., £42,900 (£18,300); Dynamos Electric Machines, £71,200 (£19,700); Motor cars, Chassis and Parts, £454,300 (£248,800); Crude Rubber, £156,300 (£50,500); Glass and Glassware, £127,200 (£94,100); and Gold, £329,000 (£274,600).

On the other hand, marked decreases were recorded in the imports of the following commodities:- Tobacco, unmanufactured, £124,500, as against (£181,900); Cotton, raw, £5,100 (£38,700); Trimming and Ornaments, £66,000 (£98,700); Cotton and Linen Piece Goods, £1,543,100 (£1,777,800); Silk Piece Goods, £835,400 (£1,026,600); Corn and Flour Bags, £111,800 (£240,200); Cotton Yarns £112,800 (£192,300); Kerosene, £123,700 (£200,600); Petrol, £703,000 (£872,000);

Printing Paper, £371,700 (£481,400); Fertilisers, £188,100 (£215,900); and Sulphur, £87,300 (£204,700).

#### EXPORTS - COMPARISON WITH PREVIOUS PERIODS.

(a) September, 1933, and September, 1932. Exports of Merchandise in September (valued in Australian currency) were £A.10,031,000, compared with £A.7,950,000 in September, 1932. Exports of Bullion and Specie were £A.792,000, as against £A.948,000 in September, 1932. The total exports amounted to £A.10,823,000 compared with £A.8,898,000 in the corresponding month of last year.

Comparing the value (in Australian currency) of the principal exports during September, 1933, with those during September, 1932, there was an increase in the export of Sausage Casings, £22,100, as against (£14,900); Currants, £38,700 (£4,000); Raisins, £262,000 (£7,600); Citrus fruits, £27,300 (£22,600); Wheat £926,600 (£878,300); Rice, £15,700 (£5,600); Wine, £47,600 (£37,300); Kangaroo and Wallaby Skins, £53,000 (£10,800); Rabbit and Hare Skins, £135,000 (£71,600); Sheepskins, £208,900 (£149,200); Wool, greasy, £4,453,900 (£2,544,600); Wool, scoured, £668,200 (£428,300); Wool, tops, £51,000 (£15,000); Pearlshell, £29,800 (£8,100); Piece Goods, £35,100 (£15,000); Ores and Concentrates - Silver, silver-lead, zinc, and other, £103,800 (£17,300); Copper, ingots, £101,700 (£47,400); Leather, £51,100 (£32,900); Timber, £40,500 (£13,500); and Silver £109,400 (£54,400).

On the other hand decreases in the value of exports of the following commodities during the two periods were recorded; Butter, £542,300, as compared with (£799,100) in September, 1932; Eggs, £257,000 (£262,000); Frozen Beef, £130,700 (£167,700); Lamb, £204,600 (£334,600); Milk and Cream, £67,000 (£87,300); Flour, £255,600 (£330,400); Sugar, £200,900 (£407,600); Tallow, £52,800 (£80,300); Coal, £15,700 (£19,500); Lead, pig, £289,500 (£293,600); Tin, ingots, £17,200 (£20,929); Zinc, bars, etc., £31,100 (£74,900); and Gold, £682,400 (£892,200).

(b) 1st Quarter, 1933-34 and 1st Quarter, 1932-33. For the three months ending 30th September, 1933, exports of Merchandise totalled £A.22,013,000 (Australian currency) as against £A.16,649,000 during the corresponding three months of 1932. Bullion and Specie shipped overseas during the first quarter of 1933-34 amounted to £A.2,489,000 as compared with £A.2,378,000 during the first quarter of 1932-33.

Exports of the following principal commodities showed increases in value during the three months of 1933-34, when compared with exports during the three months of 1932-33. Eggs, £422,800, as against (£360,300); Frozen Mutton, £81,900 (£58,100); Sausage Casings, £56,700 (£43,100); Currants, £126,200 (£72,400); Raisins, £781,800 (£353,300); Fruits, preserved in liquid, £181,100 (£126,900); Barley, £92,200 (£8,000); Wheat, £3,137,400 (£2,237,600); Rice, £46,000 (£13,200); Wine, £175,400 (£100,000); Cattle hides, £138,100 (£71,900); Fox Skins, £136,200 (£79,700); Kangaroo Skins, £88,600 (£22,600); Rabbit and Hare Skins, £515,000 (£173,300); Sheepskins, £677,300 (£296,400); Wool, greasy, £6,432,800 (£3,502,600); Wool, scoured, £1,719,600 (£957,300); Wool, tops, £133,900 (£55,200); Tallow, £179,900 (£156,400); Ores and Concentrates - Silver, and Silver-lead, £85,800 (£32); Zinc, £65,700 (£29,400), and Other Ores, etc., £71,400 (£8,000); Copper, ingots, £132,600 (£102,400); Lead, pig, £690,600 (£675,100); Tin, ingots, £73,000 (£60,200); Leather, £170,100 (£88,200); Timber, £118,000 (£58,200); Silver, £334,400 (£184,500).

On the other hand, exports of the following commodities decreased in value: Butter, £934,400, as compared with £1,859,300 during the first quarter of 1932-33; Cheese, £22,500 (£40,100); Frozen Beef, £457,700 (£543,100); Lamb, £323,400 (£537,200); Rabbits and Hares, £245,800 (£337,200); Milk and Cream, £151,200 (£190,300); Flour, £844,100 (£859,300); Sugar, £551,400 (£843,600); Coal, £75,100 (£77,900); Zinc, bars, etc., £106,400 (£138,300); and Gold £2,153,400 (£2,189,000).

(c) Quantities.

(c) Quantities. Comparing the quantities of the principal commodities exported during the first quarter of 1933-34 with those shipped overseas during the first quarter of 1932-33, the following commodities were shipped in greater quantities:- Frozen mutton; sausage casings; currants; raisins; fresh apples; wheat; cattle hides; kangaroo, wallaby, fox, rabbit, hare and sheepskins; wool, greasy, scoured, and tops; tallow; coal; and silver, silver-lead, zinc, and other ores and concentrates.

On the other hand, the quantities of the following commodities sent overseas were below those exported during the first quarter of 1932-33:- Butter; cheese; frozen beef, lamb, rabbits, and hares; milk and cream; citrus fruits; flour; lead, pig; tin, ingots; and zinc bars, etc.

(d) Declared Unit Values. A comparison of the average prices computed from the declared export values of the principal commodities sent overseas shows that the average declared prices for the following commodities were higher in September, 1933, than during the previous month (August):- Wool, greasy and scoured, sheepskins, butter, raisins, frozen beef and lamb, tallow, zinc bars, etc., and gold. Lower prices were recorded for exports of wheat, wine, frozen mutton, and lead (pig). Flour and sugar values remained steady.

Compared with the average declared prices in September, 1932, the undermentioned commodities show higher average prices:- Wool, sheepskins, flour, wine, frozen lamb, zinc bars, etc., and gold. Lower average prices were declared for wheat, butter, sugar, raisins, frozen beef and mutton, tallow and lead (pig.)
