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CAPITAL EXPENDITURE BY PRIVATE BUSINESSES IN AUSTRALIAMARCH QUARTER 1969 (PRELIMINARY)

This bulletin contains preliminary estimates of new capital expenditure by private businesses in the March quarter 1969, as well as figures for earlier periods for comparison. These preliminary estimates may be revised in a further bulletin which will be published in July 1969.

2. Seasonally adjusted estimates of new capital expenditure are shown in table 1. Details of the methods used in seasonally adjusting these and other series are given in "Seasonally Adjusted Indicators 1968" issued on 21 May 1968.
3. Estimates of capital expenditure are based on returns obtained from a sample of businesses subject to pay-roll tax, supplemented by returns from other businesses which are known to be undertaking capital expenditure projects involving expenditure of \$500,000 or more in a six-monthly period. Preliminary estimates are based on a large response from this sample.
4. Further information relating to the basis of the statistics is contained in the bulletin "Capital and Maintenance Expenditure by Private Businesses in Australia", ref. no. 5.6, for the December quarter 1969, issued on 17 April 1969.

In recent quarters, approximately 60% of total new capital expenditure in the mining industry has been on buildings and other structures; a high proportion of this has been expenditure on structures other than buildings.
