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WHOLESALE PRICE (BASIC MATERIALS AND FOODSTUFFS) INDEX
NOVEMBER, 1956.

1. The summary overleaf contains particulars of the Wholesale Price (Basic Materials and Foodstuffs) Index from 1936-37 to the present time.
2. A list of the commodities and other information concerning the index is set out in Labour Report No. 43, 1954. (See also paragraph 6 below).
3. Commodities in the index are priced in their primary or basic form wherever possible and as nearly as may be at the point where they first make effective impact on the Australian price structure. The prices of imported goods, for instance, are on an ex-bond or into factory basis.
4. The prices used have, in the main, been obtained directly from manufacturers and merchants. With a few important exceptions, they are from Melbourne sources.
5. The weights are based on estimates of the average annual consumption of the commodities in Australia during the period 1928-29 to 1934-35. The index is constructed on the aggregative fixed weights formula.
6. During 1956 supplies and prices of potatoes and onions fluctuated violently upwards and downwards between abnormally wide limits. These fluctuations were so great as to dominate the movement of the sections of the index in which these items were included, namely, "Foodstuffs and Tobacco", "Goods Principally Home Produced" and "Total All Groups". In the circumstances of the case, neither seasonal adjustment nor conversion of the index to a "changing weights" formula could be applied to eliminate these transient fluctuations. Accordingly, in order to provide a representative measure of general trend in wholesale prices, the index was reconstructed as from the base period by omitting potatoes and onions. Indexes for the months of September, October and November, 1956 comparable with previous indexes including potatoes and onions are shown in a footnote to the table overleaf.
7. Consideration is being given to the enlargement of the index to cover additional groups and to revision of the weighting pattern of the index.

(d) NOTE: The indexes for "Foodstuffs and Tobacco" "Goods Principally Home Produced" and "Total All Groups" have been reconstructed as from the base period by excluding potatoes and onions. For the months of September, October and November, 1956, respectively, indexes comparable with those previously published including potatoes and onions were "Foodstuffs and Tobacco" 378, 374 and 341; "Goods Principally Home Produced" 401, 396 and 371; "Total All Groups" 373, 371 and 354.
