

TOURIST ACCOMMODATION, VICTORIA MARCH QUARTER 1991

MAIN FEATURES

As from 1 January 1991 substantial alterations were made to area boundaries in accordance with the Australian Standard Geographical Code (ASGC), Edition 10. Consequently there are now blocks of data which are not comparable with data published for earlier quarters. Refer to page 20 for explanation of these changes. The March quarter this year included three days of the Easter Holidays which commenced on 29 March.

HOTELS, MOTELS ETC.

Room Occupancy

The room occupancy rate for hotels, motels etc. decreased to 48.0 per cent in March quarter 1991 compared with 56.6 per cent in March quarter 1990.

The Ovens-Murray (formerly North Eastern) (31.3 per cent) and Central Highlands (48.7 per cent) Statistical Divisions showed two of the largest identifiable decreases compared with March quarter 1990 room occupancy rates of 43.3 per cent and 58.0 per cent respectively.

Guest Arrivals

Guest arrivals in Victoria for the March quarter 1991 were 1,168,655 compared with 1,174,435 for the March quarter 1990 and 1,236,009 for the March quarter 1989.

Takings

Takings for hotels, motels etc. for the quarter were \$99.0m compared with \$99.2m for the March quarter 1990, a decrease of 0.1 per cent.

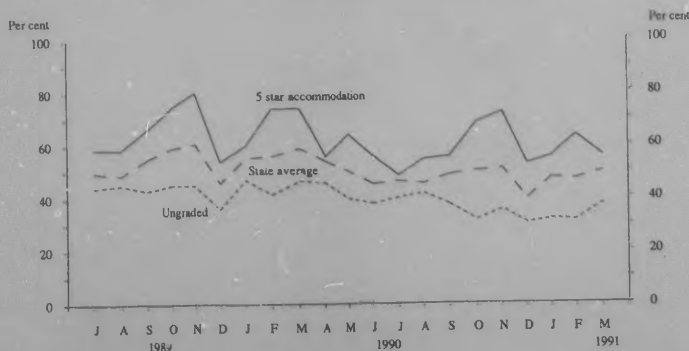
CARAVAN PARKS

The site occupancy rate for short term caravan parks in Victoria increased slightly from 40.9 per cent in the March quarter 1990 to 41.6 per cent in the March quarter 1991.

HOLIDAY FLATS & UNITS

Holiday Flats & Units reported exactly the same occupancy rates for the March quarter 1991 compared with the March quarter 1990 (50.5 per cent).

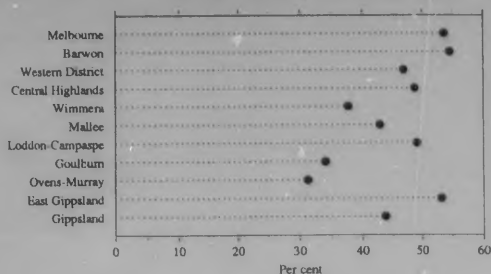
ROOM OCCUPANCY RATES: HOTELS, MOTELS, ETC. VICTORIA



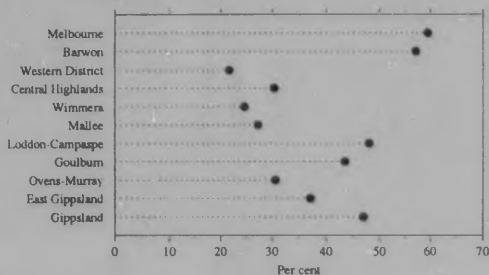

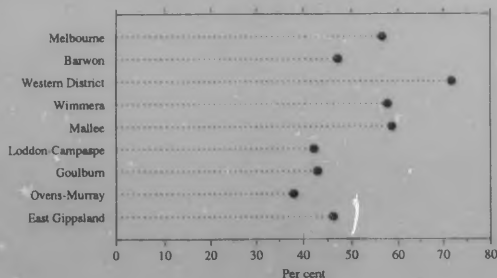
HOTELS, MOTELS ETC.: ROOM OCCUPANCY RATES, BY

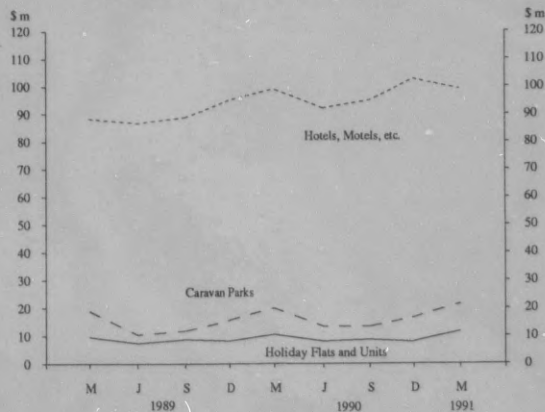

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This publication contains results, for Victoria, of the quarterly surveys of tourist accommodation establishments.

Scope and Coverage

2. A tourist accommodation establishment is defined, for the purpose of the survey, as an establishment which predominantly provides short-term accommodation (i.e. for periods of less than 2 months) available to the general public. The definition includes all caravan parks (whether predominantly providing short-term or long-term accommodation).

3. Tourist accommodation establishments currently included in the survey are:

- (a) *Licensed hotel with facilities.* An accommodation establishment which is licensed to operate a public bar, provides a bath or shower and toilet in most guest rooms, and has breakfast available for guests.
- (b) *Motel, licensed or unlicensed, private hotel or guest house with facilities.* An accommodation establishment which provides a bath or shower and toilet in most guest rooms and has breakfast available for guests. This category also includes motels that are licensed to serve liquor with or without meals.
- (c) *Caravan park.* An accommodation establishment which provides powered sites for caravans and toilet, shower and laundry facilities for guests. A *short-term caravan park* is one which is predominantly occupied by short-term guests (i.e. guests staying for less than 2 months). A *long-term caravan park* is one which is predominantly occupied by long-term guests (i.e. guests staying for 2 months or more). Note that data collected and published for each type of establishment include both long-term and short-term residents at these establishments.
- (d) *Holiday flat, unit or house* (excluding any establishment predominantly operated on a time share basis). Accommodation establishments which are operated by owners or managers who have sole letting rights to at least 5 flats, units or houses, or by real estate agents for short-term letting, are mainly self-contained in terms of cooking, bath (or shower) and toilet facilities but do not have breakfast available for guests. Note that data collected and published for each type of establishment include both long-term and short-term guests at these establishments.

4. Because of the limitations of the information available for updating lists of tourist accommodation establishments, some delay may occur between the opening of an establishment and its inclusion in the survey. The effect of these delays on published occupancy rates is generally considered to be insignificant.

Definitions

5. *Number of establishments* refers to the number of tourist accommodation establishments within the scope of the survey which operated during the survey period. Included are those establishments which operated for any part of the quarter or which closed temporarily for the quarter for seasonal reasons. An establishment comprising more than one type of accommodation activity referred to in paragraph 3 above (e.g. a motel with attached caravan park) is treated as two separate establishments.

6. *Number of letting entities* refers to the number of owners, managers or real estate agents of holiday flats, units and houses within the scope of the survey who operated during the survey period.

7. *Guest rooms* refers to the maximum number of rooms, units, suites, etc. available for accommodating paying guests at hotels and motels with facilities during the survey period.

8. *Bed spaces* refers to the maximum number of bed spaces (excluding cots) available to accommodate paying guests at hotels and motels with facilities during the survey period. Three-quarter beds are classified as single beds; double beds are counted as two bed spaces.

9. *Guest arrivals* refers to the total number of paying guests counted on the first night they stayed at the accommodation establishment.

10. *Guest nights* refers to the total number of nights each paying guest stayed during the survey period.

11. *Room nights* refers to the total number of nights each guest room is occupied by a paying guest during the survey period.

12. *Room occupancy rate* refers to the proportion of guest rooms occupied to the number of guest rooms available during the survey period expressed as a percentage.

13. *Bed occupancy rate* refers to the proportion of bed spaces occupied to the number of bed spaces available during the survey period expressed as a percentage.

14. *Average length of stay* refers to the ratio of guest nights to guest arrivals.

15. *Powered sites* refers to the maximum number of sites with provision for connection to electric power supply, which are available at caravan parks for accommodating paying guests during the survey period. Included are powered sites occupied by on-site vans.

16. *Unpowered sites* refers to the maximum number of sites, with no provision for connection to electric power supply, which are available at caravan parks for accommodating paying guests during the survey period.

17. *Cabins, flats, etc.* refers to the maximum number of cabins, flats, units and villas which are available at caravan parks for accommodating paying guests during the survey period.

18. *Site nights* refers to the total number of nights each powered or unpowered site, cabin, flat, etc. is occupied by a paying guest during the survey period.

19. *Sites occupied by long-term guests* refers to the total number of sites occupied by long-term residents (i.e. guests who have stayed continuously for 2 months or more) at the end of the survey period.

20. *Site occupancy rate* refers to the proportion of site nights to the total caravan park capacity available during the survey period expressed as a percentage. From the September quarter 1988, the treatment of sites permanently reserved for privately owned vans has changed. Previously, usage of these sites was recorded only when they were occupied. As these sites are not available to either the public or caravan park operators for accommodation, they are recorded as permanently occupied. Care should be taken when comparing site occupancy rates from the September quarter 1988 with previous quarters.

21. *Units* refers to the maximum number of holiday flats, units and houses available for short-term accommodation.

22. *Unit nights* refers to the total number of nights each holiday flat, unit or house is occupied during the survey period.

23. *Unit occupancy rate* refers to the proportion of unit nights to total units available during the survey period expressed as a percentage.

24. *Unit lettings* refers to the total number of times a holiday flat, unit or house was occupied by a new tenant, counted only on the first night it was occupied by the new tenant.

25. *Takings from accommodation* refers to revenue received from the provision of short-term and long-term accommodation at the accommodation establishments. Takings from meals are excluded. Takings from accommodation for each month represent the takings received during that month. In the case of some establishments where payments are received in advance of, or after, the provision of accommodation to guests, the monthly figure for takings from accommodation may not necessarily bear a direct relationship to the number of guests accommodated during the month. Rental and storage fees paid to caravan parks for the keeping of private vans in parks are included in the takings of the month they are received.

26. *Star grading* refers to the grading of hotels and motels with facilities and is based on the classification system used by members of the Australian Automobile Association (AAA). The gradings are allocated according

to a points system based on the amenities and facilities available to guests. Details of the grading system are contained in the AAA publication *Australian National Tourguide*, or the individual tour guides produced by members of the AAA.

For the purposes of classifying establishments to a star grading in this publication, 'half' gradings are ignored, (e.g. two and a half star gradings have been shown as two star gradings).

Ungraded. The "ungraded" category includes establishments that have not yet been graded by the AAA, and those that do not meet the minimum standard required to receive a star grading.

27. *Employment.* Details of the number of persons working at accommodation establishments (including those working on other than accommodation activities) have not been included in this publication. However data are available upon request from the ABS.

Statistical Areas of Victoria

28. This bulletin contains data presented according to the Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC), Edition 10. Under this classification, statistical areas are defined as follows:

STATISTICAL LOCAL AREAS (SLAs).

These geographic areas are in most cases either identical with, or have been aggregated to, the previously published whole or part legal Local Government Areas (LGAs) comprising boroughs (B), cities (C), municipalities (M), rural cities (RC), shires (S) and towns (T). In aggregate, SLAs cover the whole of the State without gaps or overlaps. In some cases legal LGAs overlap Statistical Subdivision boundaries and therefore comprise two SLAs (Part A and Part B).

STATISTICAL SUBDIVISIONS (SSDs).

These consist of one or more SLAs and form the intermediate size spatial unit for the presentation of regional data.

STATISTICAL DIVISIONS (SDs).

These consist of one or more Statistical Subdivisions (SSDs). Where SSDs are not shown for statistical purposes, statistical local areas are shown ordered alphabetically within statistical divisions. The Divisions are designed to be relatively homogeneous regions characterised by identifiable social and economic units within the region, under the unifying influence of one or more major towns or cities.

STATISTICAL DISTRICTS.

To provide comparable statistics over a period of time, Statistical Districts have been defined around selected urban centres, with a population of 25,000 or more, experiencing urban growth beyond the legal local government area boundaries. Those districts are intended to contain the anticipated urban spread over the next 20 years.

29. From 1 January 1991, Victoria was re-defined into eleven Statistical Divisions (some of which were re-named), a reduction of one. Because this involved substantial boundary alterations with consequent apparent movement of establishments across SD's great care should be exercised if attempting to compare data published before the change with that published after it.

Unpublished statistics

30. The ABS may also make available on request certain unpublished tourist accommodation statistics, including employment statistics. A charge may be made for this information.

CHANGES TO STATISTICAL DIVISION (SD) BOUNDARIES (Effective 1 January 1991)

Victorian SD boundaries were established prior to the 1966 Census of Population and Housing. A review of these statistical geographic boundaries was recently undertaken by the ABS (with extensive input from various interested organisations) in line with criteria outlined below.

The main criteria in determining SD boundaries was that the boundaries were relatively homogeneous from social, economic, and geographic perspectives, that they would remain unchanged for a period of 15 to 20 years, and that any changes would be introduced in time for the 1991 Census of Population and Housing. As a result of this review a number of changes have been made to SDs. These changes, implemented from 1 January 1991, are outlined below.

Statistical Division	Changes
Melbourne	Extended to include the entire Shires of Healesville, Pakenham and Cranbourne and Part A of the Shire of Upper Yarra. Result: A total of eight hotels, motels etc. with facilities, two short-term caravan parks and three long-term caravan parks were added to the MSD.
Barwon	No change.
South Western	Name changed to Western District.
Central Highlands	No change.
Wimmera	The Shires of Karkaroc and Birchip have been included in Mallee SD. Now includes the Shire of Kara Kara and the Town of St Arnaud from Loddon-Campaspe. Result: The addition of one hotel, motel etc. with facilities and one long-term caravan park and the loss of three short-term caravan parks.
Northern Mallee	Renamed Mallee. Now includes the Shires of Karkaroc and Birchip from Wimmera SD. Result: The addition of three hotels, motels etc. with facilities and three short-term caravan parks.
Loddon-Campaspe	The Shire of Kara Kara and the Town of St Arnaud have been included in Wimmera SD. Result: The loss of four hotels, motels etc. with facilities and one long-term caravan park.
Goulburn	No change.
North Eastern	Renamed Ovens-Murray.

ABS TOURISM STATISTICS

Data on the "tourist industry" is provided by the ABS from a number of different sources and collections. Some of the sources may be termed as "tourism specific", in that the collection is designed specifically to provide data on one or more aspects of the tourist industry. Other sources are "tourism related" and provide information on a number of industries (including tourism).

TOURISM SPECIFIC COLLECTIONS

1. Domestic Travel and Tourism Survey (Cat.No. 9216.0)

This survey was last conducted in 1983. It provides data on domestic travel and geographic characteristics of people identified as travellers. The data is available at the national, state and regional levels.

2. Service Industries Survey

The 1986-87 survey covered businesses in tourism and related tourism services.

3. Overseas Arrivals and Departures

(Cat.No's. 3401.0, 3402.0, and 3404.0)

The data is available on a monthly, quarterly and annual basis. In addition to the number of overseas arrivals and departures, data is also available on type of traveller, country of embarkation, intended length of stay and Australian state of stay.

TOURISM RELATED COLLECTIONS

1. Household Expenditure Survey (Cat.No. 6553.0)

This survey includes state level expenditure by Australians on overseas holidays and Australian holidays. At the national level expenditure information can be provided on fares and accommodation.

2. Building Approvals (Cat.No. 8731.2)

Information available includes number of approvals by type of building (eg. hotels, shops, factories, entertainment and recreational) and \$ value (in value groupings).

3. State and Local Government Finance

The ABS collects very detailed information on State and local government expenditure. This source provides an insight into expenditure on the following areas of interest:

Tourism and area promotion
Creative and performing arts

National Parks and Wildlife
Recreational facilities and services

4. Consumer Price Index (Cat.No. 6401.0)

The CPI includes information on price movement by state for such items as holiday travel, accommodation and transportation.

5. Retail Trade (Cat.No. 8501.0)

This publication provides monthly \$ turnover data for retail industries and a number of selected services included in the "Hospitality Sector"; ie hotels & licensed clubs and cafes & restaurants.
