PRODUCTION STATISTICS : JANUARY AND FEBRUARY 1975

EXPLANATORY NOTES

This bulletin contains statistics of production in Australia of mines and factory products and electricity and gas. An alphabetical index of these products is given on pages 2 to 5.

2. The following details are shown for each product :

- (a) Annual totals for the latest three complete financial years;
- (b) Monthly details for each of the latest fourteen months;
- (c) Cumulative totals from July 1974 to date;
- (d) Cumulative totals for the corresponding period twelve months earlier.

3. The monthly figures are based for the most part on returns collected by the Australian Bureau of Statistics in each State. Where another authority is the source, this is shown in a footnote. The figures for 1971-72 are derived from the Annual Manufacturing Census. All other annual figures are derived from the recorded monthly production and are subject to revision. In a small number of cases returns are accepted from factories for a year other than the normal financial year ending in June.

4. The commodity production data contained in this bulletin were collected from those establishments classified to division C (Manufacturing) as defined in the *Australian Standard Industrial Classification, Preliminary Edition* 1969, Vol. 1, and from those mining, retail and wholesale establishments with sales and transfers out of goods of own manufacture in excess of \$10,000.

5. Further details in respect of many of the items will be found on an annual basis in the bulletin *Manufacturing Commodities - Principal Articles Produced* (Reference No. 12.26) and on a monthly basis, in the *Monthly Production Summaries* (Reference No. 12.16), issued by this Bureau six to eight weeks after the period to which they relate. A list of these *Monthly Production Summaries* appears on page 32 of this publication.

6. The bulletin contains seasonally adjusted statistics of several items. In the seasonal adjustment, account has been taken not only of normal seasonal factors but also of "trading-day" effects (arising from the varying numbers of Sundays, Mondays, Tuesdays, etc. in the month) and the influence of Easter and Australia Day which may, in successive years, affect figures for different months. The seasonally adjusted figures have been revised following annual reanalysis. Details of the methods used in seasonally adjusting these and other series will be given in *Seasonally Adjusted Indicators 1975* (Reference No. 1.10) to be issued shortly.

7. Most items are identified by Commodity Codes which are derived from the Commodity Classification used in the Australian Manufacturing Statistics. In some cases where data is derived from sources other than Factory Collections, no Commodity Code is shown.
