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PREFACE

For the first time in Australia, preliminary estimates of census results have been made on a sample basis. Priority has been given to the processing of the census data for a sample of three thousand of the more than twenty thousand census collector's districts covering the Commonwealth to provide preliminary census results some months before the final census publications can be prepared. These preliminary results of the 1971 Census of Population and Housing are presented in this bulletin.

The use of sampling methods imposes some restrictions on the extent to which detailed classifications can be provided in these preliminary estimates. It is to be noted also that, being based upon a sample, these preliminary results can be expected to differ somewhat from the final results. An indication of the sampling errors attaching to the figures published in this bulletin is given in the explanatory notes.

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EXPLANATORY NOTES

This bulletin contains details of the characteristics of population and dwellings in Australia derived from the processing of a sample of the census records. A ten per cent sample of Census Collector's Districts (CD's) was selected from across the five mainland States. All CD's in Tasmania, Northern Territory and the Australian Capital Territory were included. Priority was given to the processing of census data for the CD's so selected to provide on a sample basis the preliminary results shown in this bulletin. Processing of the data for the remaining CD's is proceeding and in due course the results for all CD's will be aggregated as a complete enumeration for publication as the final census results.

Before selection, CD's in the five mainland States were grouped into geographic strata consisting of local government areas of similar demographic and physical characteristics, each stratum containing approximately 200 CD's. A ten per cent sample of CD's in each stratum was selected systematically giving each CD the same chance of selection.

To obtain estimates of aggregates as shown in the following tables it was necessary to expand the data for the sample CD's by a process of sample estimation. Merely to have multiplied the data for the ten per cent sample CD's by a factor of ten would have resulted in estimates of totals differing from previously published census field counts to the extent of their sampling errors. To reduce possibly sizeable discrepancies on this account, ratio estimation was employed. This involved independently expanding the sample data for males, females and dwellings for each stratum by the ratio of the number of males, females and dwellings in the stratum (obtained in compiling census field counts) to the comparable aggregates for sample CD's in the stratum. This estimation procedure gives a sample estimate which differs slightly from the total population previously published in Field Count Statement No. 1 and which, because of sampling error, can be expected to differ from the final total population.

The following table shows, for each State and Territory, the earlier field count total, the estimate derived from the sample, and for each of the mainland States the estimated sample error of the sample estimate.

The sample error is one measure of the likely difference between the sample estimates and the final totals and indicates the extent to which an estimate might have varied by chance because only a sample and not all CD's

have been included. There are about two chances in three that a sample estimate will differ by less than one sample error from the final census figure and about nineteen chances in twenty that the difference will be less than two sample errors.

As space does not allow for the separate indication of the sample errors of all estimates in this publication two tables of sample errors intended to be of general application are given below.

The estimates of sampling errors shown in the table above are based on estimates of sample errors made for a wide range of the characteristics covered in the census and shown in this bulletin. However, they are averages only and the sample errors of estimates for some characteristics are actually somewhat higher and for others somewhat lower than those shown in the table depending upon the degree and nature of the geographic clustering of those characteristics throughout the country.

In addition to sample errors it should be recognised that in processing census data for 13 million persons and 4.5 million households there are innumerable possibilities for other errors. As in other areas of statistics, much of the effort of statisticians is directed to devising procedures which prevent most errors from occurring or which detect and eliminate those which do occur. Despite such efforts it is impracticable to eliminate every inaccuracy but special steps such as editing and quality control procedures are taken to measure and control the level of such inaccuracy. Thus while some minor errors and discrepancies may be evident in the final results, it is unlikely that they would have any practical significance in the interpretation of the census data.

In conformity with the 1967 repeal of Section 127 of the Constitution, 1971 Census statistics include Aborigines.

Persons with diplomatic immunity (diplomatic and home based staff of diplomatic missions, and their families) are excluded from the census. Dwellings occupied by persons with diplomatic immunity are also excluded.

Any discrepancies between totals and sums of components in the tables are due to rounding.

Notes on characteristics of the populationTables 4 and 5. Period of residence

For the first time in Australian censuses overseas-born persons were asked whether they were a resident of, or a visitor to, Australia. The number of years an overseas-born person has been a resident of Australia has been defined as commencing from the date of first arrival as a resident.

Table 7. Level of schooling

At the 1966 Census persons were asked to state the highest level of schooling completed. For the 1971 Census the question was redesigned to obtain a measure of the highest level ever attended.

Education systems differ between the Australian States and the question of schooling was varied appropriately on schedules used in different States.

The following table was used to assign grades (or forms) in each State to an approximately comparable level.

Table 8. Occupational status

The questions used in the Census to determine labour force participation were as follows:

- Did this person have a full or part-time job, or business or farm of any kind last week?
- Did this person do any work at all last week for payment or profit?
- Was this person temporarily laid off by his employer without pay for the WHOLE of last week?
- Did this person look for work last week?

The employed population comprises persons 15 years of age and over who, in the week prior to the Census, either did any work at all for payment or profit or had a job from which they were temporarily absent. Persons helping but not receiving wages or salary who usually worked less than 15 hours a week are excluded from the employed but are included in the unemployed if they looked for work.

Unemployed persons are those who are not employed and who were either laid off without pay for the whole week or were actively looking for work.

The employed and the unemployed together comprise the "labour force". This term is used throughout 1971 Census publications in place of "work force" in conformity with the Bureau's quarterly population survey and with international usage.

This approach conforms closely to the recommendations of the Eighth International Conference of Labour Statisticians held in Geneva in 1954 and to the approach used at the 1966 Census.

According to the definition any labour force activity during the previous week, however little, results in the person being counted in the labour force.

Thus many persons whose main activity is not a labour force one (e.g. housewife, full-time student) are drawn into the labour force by virtue of part-time or occasional labour force activity in the previous week. Answers to the question on usual major activity indicate that there were substantially more of such persons at the census of 1971 than at the census of 1966 and that they were predominantly females.

On the other hand, the definition excludes persons who may frequently or usually participate in the labour force but who in the previous week happened to have withdrawn from the labour force. Answers to the question on usual major activity indicate that there were substantially more of such persons at the census of 1971 than at the census of 1966, especially among males.

A similar definition of the labour force is used in the quarterly population sample survey conducted by the Bureau by the method of personal interview. This survey is used to measure changes in the labour force from quarter to quarter in the intercensal period.

Evidence from post-enumeration surveys and pilot tests indicates that the personal interview approach tends to identify a larger number of persons as in the labour force than does the filling in of the census questions on the schedule by the householder and that this tendency has increased between the 1966 and 1971 Censuses.

The above considerations should be borne in mind if comparisons of the total labour force or labour force participation rates are made between the 1966 and the 1971 Censuses, or between the 1971 Census and the 1971 labour force quarterly estimates.

Table 9. Occupation

Table 9 relates only to the employed population, 15 years of age and over.

Occupation is defined as the type of work performed by an employed person and should not be confused with the type of productive activity, business or service carried out by the establishment in which a person works, e.g. a carpenter employed by a steel-making establishment would have the occupation of "carpenter" and industry "steel manufacture"; an electrician working at a steel-making establishment would have the occupation of "electrician" but his industry would be "steel manufacture".

The classification of persons to an occupation based upon the replies provided on census schedules can be a most difficult task. This is particularly so in respect of occupations described as "professional". This can be simply illustrated by taking the reply "engineer" which is provided on census schedules by persons ranging from university graduates in engineering to mechanics of various types, locomotive drivers and attendants of stationary engines.

Much of this difficulty can be overcome by studying the answers to the census questions on qualifications held, but considerable knowledge of qualifications is needed to use them effectively in coding occupations. Such knowledge could not be conveyed in a simple set of instructions to the coders employed for census processing.

For this reason occupation minor group OA (Architects, engineers and surveyors, professional) has been limited solely to persons holding a university degree. Other persons describing themselves in professional terms but not holding a degree were classified to minor group OK (Draftsmen and technicians NEC).

This is of course too restrictive a definition of many "professional" occupations and consequently a set of tabulations of the individual occupations in minor group OK cross-classified by tertiary qualifications held (other than university degrees) will be produced as a supplement to all tabulations showing occupation at the minor group level. Information from these supplementary tabulations will be available on request.

Table 10. Industry

Table 10 relates only to the employed population, 15 years of age and over.

Industry is defined as the branch of productive activity, business or service carried out by the establishment in which a person is employed.

For the Population Census an "undefined" category was added to certain Divisions of the classification to facilitate the coding of imprecise or generalised descriptions of industrial activities on the census schedules. In Table 10 these "undefined" categories have not been shown separately but have been included in the 'Total' for each Division.

Table 13. Nationality

British nationality includes all persons who, by virtue of the Nationality and Citizenship Act 1948-1966 (Section 7 and Regulation 5A), are deemed to be British subjects.

In a small number of cases persons of British nationality and birthplace have inadvertently been shown as having "nationality same as birthplace" rather than as "British".

Table 17. Qualifications

For the 1971 Census qualifications have been classified to five major levels and specific fields within each level. The levels have been determined as follows:

Trade : formal recognition of competence in a skilled manual occupation which is usually obtained through an apprenticeship and satisfactory progress in part-time studies concurrently with practical training (e.g. plumber, fitter, compositor, carpenter, hairdresser).

Technician: a level which requires theoretical knowledge, as well as practical skills, e.g. wool classing or murring. Certificates issued by technical colleges following periods of 4 or 5 years part-time study after passing intermediate or final secondary school examinations are classified as "technician".

Tertiary (other than university degree): a level relating to qualifications obtained following substantial advanced study beyond matriculation conferred by institutions and professional associations, e.g. Associate of Australian Society of Accountants, Diploma in Business Studies, Teaching Certificate, Diploma of Engineering.

Bachelor degree: usually conferred by a university following a period of at least 3 years study full-time or equivalent part-time study.

Higher degree: conferred by a university in recognition of substantial studies beyond the Bachelor degree and usually requiring as a pre-requisite a Bachelor degree at honours level.

Some qualifications could not be classified to any of the above levels. Most of these relate to short specialised courses in such fields as typewriting and shorthand, farm book-keeping, dressmaking and automotive maintenance.

Persons who were qualified and studying for a qualification are shown in Table 17 according to the qualification held. All persons studying for a higher degree therefore appear in the table as qualified at the Bachelor degree level.

Table 18. Sector of industry

Government employees comprise not only administrative employees, but also all other employees of government bodies (Commonwealth, State, local and semi-government) on services such as railways, road transport, banks, post office, air transport, education (including universities), broadcasting, television, police, public works, factories, departmental hospitals and institutions, migrant hostels, etc.

Notes on characteristics of dwellings

Villa units are groups of three or more single or double-storey homes, separate or joined together in sets of two or more, all occupying a common block of land.

Self-contained flats are those flats which can be completely closed off and which have their own cooking and bathing facilities.

"Other private" includes non-self-contained flats and such sheds, huts, caravans, etc. which are occupied on a permanent or semi-permanent basis.

Non-private dwellings are those dwellings which provide group accommodation such as hotels, motels and hostels, etc. and health and welfare institutions.

NOTE. In these computer-generated tables some abbreviations have been used in order to present the data in the space available. Examples of these are:
