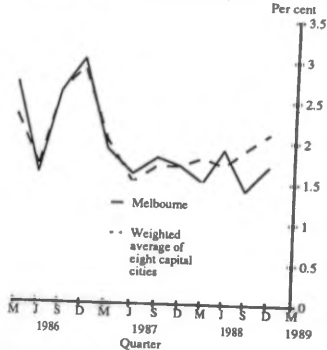

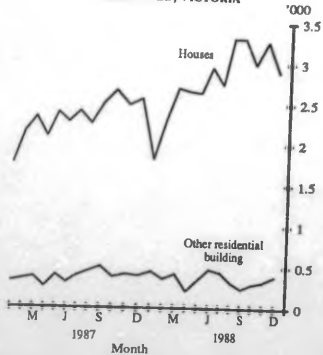
UNEMPLOYMENT RATE OF THE CIVILIAN POPULATION AGED 15 YEARS AND OVER



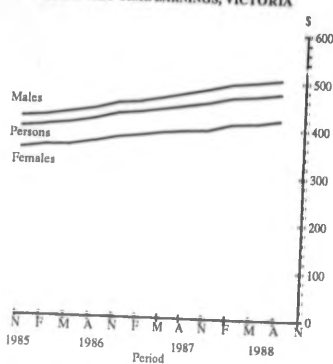
CONSUMER PRICE INDEX: ALL GROUPS
Percentage change from previous quarter



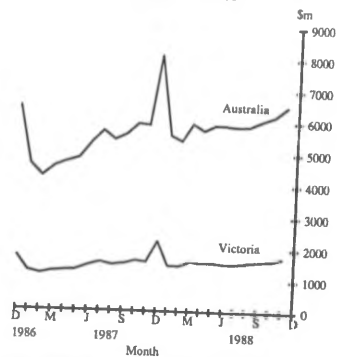
NUMBER OF DWELLING UNITS APPROVED, VICTORIA



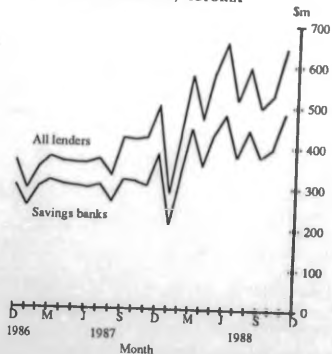
FULL-TIME ADULT AVERAGE WEEKLY ORDINARY TIME EARNINGS, VICTORIA



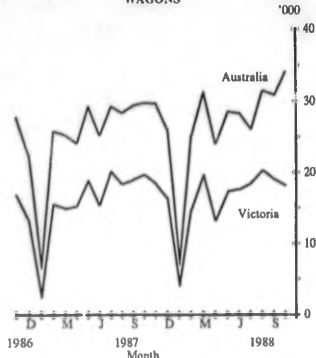
TURNOVER OF RETAIL ESTABLISHMENTS



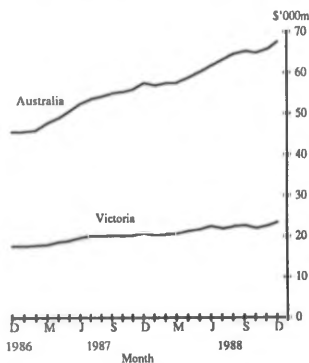
SECURED HOUSING FINANCE COMMITMENTS TO INDIVIDUALS, VICTORIA

WAGONS



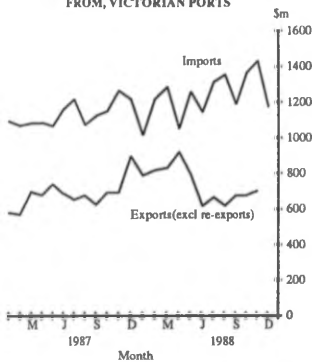
SAVINGS BANKS: DEPOSITORS' BALANCES
