#### MAIN FEATURES

For the five months ended November 1984, red meat production at 842,054 tonnes, continued to show a decline (9.1%) compared with the same period of the previous year. However, for the same period, production figures for mutton and pigment have continued to rise, up 24.0% and 2.7% respectively.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTES

##### Introduction

This publication contains information (preliminary where footnoted) on livestock slaughterings, meat, milk intake by factories, market milk sales by factories and receipts of wool by wool brokers and dealers.

##### Livestock slaughterings and meat

2. The information on livestock slaughterings and meat is restricted to preliminary estimates of livestock slaughterings, meat production, exports of fresh, frozen and processed meat and stocks of frozen meat.

3. The statistics on slaughterings and meat production are based on a monthly collection from abattoirs and other major slaughtering establishments and include estimates of animals slaughtered on farms and by country butchers and other small slaughtering establishments.

4. Care should be taken when using this information as the figures only relate to slaughterings for human consumption and do not include animals condemned or those killed for boiling down. Also, definitions of livestock categories may differ between States and within States, particularly with regard to calves.

5. Poultry slaughtering statistics have been compiled from returns supplied by commercial poultry slaughtering establishments. Producers in the Northern Territory and the Australian Capital Territory and the many very small producers are excluded from the collection; however, the statistics represent a high level of coverage. The Queensland statistics are based on data collected by the Queensland Department of Primary Industries.

##### Milk

6. Tables 6 and 7 contain statistics collected by the Australian Dairy Corporation (ADC) on the intake of whole milk and the sales of market milk by factories.

##### Wool receipts

7. The statistics in Table 8 show the amount of taxable wool received by brokers and dealers from wool producers. It excludes wool received by brokers on which tax has already been paid by other dealers (private buyers) or brokers.

8. The information shown is on the basis of the State in which the wool has actually been received and does not necessarily reflect the production of wool in that State.

##### Seasonal adjustment

9. Details of seasonally adjusted figures for meat, milk and wool are shown in Tables 2, 6 and 8 respectively. Information on the methods used in seasonally adjusting these series is contained in *Seasonally Adjusted Indicators, Australia* (1308.0).

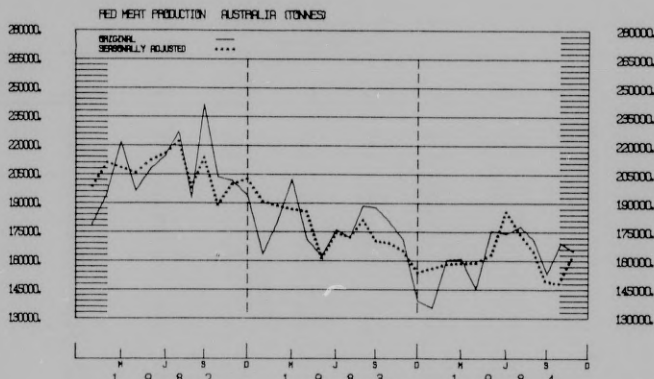

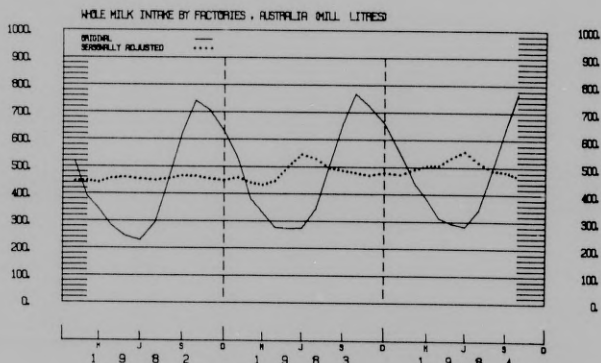
